CG Evans, 89, passed away peacefully on February 22, 2026, in Bellingham, Washington. He was born October 29, 1936, in Abilene, Texas, to GW Evans and Aileen Wilbanks Evans and grew up in Big Spring, Texas as the oldest of three brothers. He graduated from Big Spring High School and spent his freshman year in the Corps at his beloved Texas A&M before returning home to begin his life and family. He was a lifelong Aggie fan.

Above all, he wanted to live his life in a way that honored his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. He will be greatly missed by so many here on Earth but is now whole and complete in Heaven.
