Some of his murals can be seen at the Two Medicine Dinosaur Center in Bynum, MT, where he spent many summers fossil-hunting with his friend Dave Trexler; and on walls throughout Lummi Nation High School.

Dave is survived by his beloved wife of 24 years, Jacqueline A. Braun; cherished cousin Nancy (Frank) Principe of Anacortes and numerous relatives throughout the country; and dear friend Andy Ward and many adored friends. He will be remembered as a devoted friend of the Lummi Nation.
