March 14, 1968 - April 24, 2026

Grudgingly, kicking and fighting, David Richard Wilson, age 58, passed away, following a long road of health-related trials and tribulations on Friday, April 24th, 2026. He wasn't a stranger to death's door; following a dance with cancer and all the health issues that ensued. Still, the reality of his passing sent tsunami sized shock waves through the hearts of those that knew him and loved him.

Born March 14 ,1968 to Clifford and Sandra Wilson of Maple Falls, Dave was the oldest of 3 siblings and the one most skilled in the art of building tree forts ever to live this side of the Mississippi. Riding BMX bikes (no helmet of course), shooting guns, orchestrating Roman candle fights, and roaming the mountains and rivers outside Maple Falls were some of Dave's passion growing up. Dave still holds the record for the tallest tree fort ever built in Maple Falls; soaring 7 stories high into the Doug Fir that rose above that patch of dirt he called home.

Dave found his calling in the roofing profession, working for Mt. Baker Roofing for many years. Dave always prided himself on his work; rightfully proclaiming that everyone looked up to him; well, because he worked on roofs. Becoming a roofer came as no surprise given his tree fort building skills. He will be remembered as a good neighbor and friend, always willing to lend a leathery, firm hand to anyone who needed help.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and leaves behind his former wife Lara, his children Carson and Amy, his brother Alan, sister Shannon, and nephews Calvin, Nico, and Devin. There are many others that Dave leaves behind as he enters heaven's gate that will miss his calm nature, irreverent sense of humor; and just being a damn good friend.

A memorial service honoring Dave's life will be held Tuesday, May 12th at 11:00am within the Beth Israel section of Bayview Cemetery; followed by a reception within the Horizon room of Moles Funeral Home.
