Douglas loved to be goofy and to make those around him laugh, especially his family. He also had an infamous, self-proclaimed talent for rapping, spitting rhymes for anyone and everyone. He was a fisherman, construction/laborer, and he worked for Lummi Commod Squad as a woodcutter.

On February 19, 2020, Douglas became a daddy to Dallas Marshall Jones. As a father Douglas shined, his unconditional love for his daughter showed through and through. Dallas Marshall became his new best friend and true mini-Dougie. There wasn't anything he wouldn't have done for her; he was her protector and absolutely adored her.
