



## Emma Elizabeth Moen

January 22, 1906 - September 8, 2013

Emma E. Moen passed away peacefully, with family by her side, on September 8, 2013. She was 107. Emma was born January 22, 1906 in Ferndale, WA to Joseph and Hila May Newberry. She was preceded in death by her parents, three sisters and her husband Arthur Moen. She leaves her sons, Richard and wife Adena of Bellingham, and Robert and wife Vivian of Snohomish along with 4 grandchildren, 9 great-grandchildren and 1 great-great-grandchild.

Emma graduated from Ferndale High School, moved to Bellingham and worked for Puget Power at their switchboard. She then went to Seattle and lived with an older sister while attending business college. After returning to Bellingham, she worked in a title office where she met her future husband Arthur, who also worked in a title office. They were married in 1928. She then worked for the Port of Bellingham at the Municipal Dock as the bookkeeper. Most of the freight arriving in Bellingham was shipped by boat at that time. She later worked at another title company and part time for the Treasurers office and the Street Department office in Bellingham City Hall. She enjoyed fishing the Nooksack River, crocheting and reading.

Emma was a longtime resident of The Willows Retirement Apartments.
