Glen was born in Henry County-Trenton, Iowa to Clifford Jay Hallman and Alma Bonney Hallman on November 19th, 1924. Clifford and his family moved and settled into the Didsbury/Bergen, Alberta area to help pastor/teach in the Mennonite Brethren Church. As WW II approached and ran its course, Glen saw many of the young men of his area volunteer to serve in military service. Glen enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1944 to retain his U.S. citizenship.

After the war Glen enrolled in Seattle Pacific College in Seattle and soon met Helen Jean Bateman, from Forrestburg, South Dakota. Helen Jean soon agreed to marry Glen in 1948. After working in Seattle and Kitsap County, Glen found employment in the Whatcom County Public Health Department, where he worked for 20 years as a Sanitation Officer. Then in 1971, he was hired as the first Executive Officer for the Northwest Air Pollution Authority in Mt. Vernon, Washington.

Glen retired from his official state employment in 1986, but continued to serve

in many positions of civic involvement as a volunteer in different agencies. Glen has several personal commendation letters from past and present Governors. Within the last two months, Glen was honored on the State level as the first recipient of a life time achievement award from the State Opportunity Councils. On Tuesday, November 26th, the Whatcom County Executive will proclaim the day "Glen Hallman Day", as a tribute to his service to the local and state communities.

Glen is survived by: His daughter, Gayle Hallman, of Bellingham; son Rod Hallman and his wife Urpha from Vancouver, Washington; son Jeff Hallman and his wife Janet of Roseburg, Oregon; five grandchildren: Matthew Hallman and his wife Danielle of Menifee, California; Beth Hallman, of Roseburg; Alec Hallman and his wife Vera of Portland, Oregon; Mitchell Hallman and his wife, Amanda of Vancouver; Laura Marquand of Bellingham; and great grandsons David and Aaron Hallman of Portland.
