Jason A Swanson was born to Lisa Marie (Li) Swan and Aaron Gadberry on February 15, 1994 in Anacortes, Washington. Jason died suddenly on June 1, 2018 in Sedro-Woolley, WA. Jason grew up in Sedro-Woolley, raised by Li Swan and Will Swanson. Jason attended Sedro Woolley High School and State Street High School.

Jason had a big heart and is remembered for going out of his way to help others, even when he had unmet needs of his own. Jason had many “homes” where he would pitch in and help out.
