



Larry Wayne Myatt

June 15, 1945 - May 1, 2026

Larry Wayne Myatt's journey through life ended quietly at his home in north Bellingham, Washington earlier this year.

He was born in 1945, the son of G. Wayne and Opal (Riley) Myatt and brother to Carolyn and Sharon. His growing up years included a 2-year stay in Laurel, Washington while his parents operated the Meridian Mercantile grocery store. He was baptized as a child at First Baptist Church in Ferndale, Washington.

He graduated from Bellingham High School in 1963, attended community college and was employed by Boeing for a year while living with his sister, Sharon and her family in Edmonds, Washington.

Afterwards he returned home to Bellingham and lived with Wayne and Opal during his first years of working as an engineering technician for Whatcom County Roads Department.

His job there involved playing a key role in the design, construction and maintenance of the county's roads.

His parents helped him with renovating and moving into a small house in South Bellingham in the early 1970s. A niece helped him with getting a cat that he named Guy.

His nieces and nephews' memories of Larry, at that time, feature his passion for watching football games during Sunday family dinners, playing Beatles and Three Dog Night songs (such as Joy to the World) on an 8-track player, watching Rowan & Martin's Laugh-In TV show and reading MAD magazines. He owned and drove a red 1966 Mustang.

In the years following Larry remained close with his parents and if not at work, could be found either playing tennis (for which he won trophies) or at the downtown Bellingham Public Library reading the newspaper during lunch breaks.

He never married or had any children. He retired in 1999 and following his dad's passing in 2004, preferred to keep to himself.

His final road brings him to Greenacres Cemetery in Ferndale where he is being buried with his parents and sister, Sharon. The graveside service takes place at 2 p.m., May 27, 2026.
