Marsha D. Davis of Bellingham passed away on Saturday, September 9, 2017 at the age of 83. She was born September 1, 1934 in Seattle to Stephen Marsh and Alice Davis. Marsha graduated from Stadium High School in Tacoma. She attended Washington State College (WSU) and became a lifelong supporter of the Cougars — “Go Cougs!”

Marsha loved to travel, and while visiting Hawaii, she met her husband, Jack R. Davis. They were married on January 31, 1959 in Tacoma. Jack’s military career took them to Air Force bases around the country where she was actively involved in the Officers’ Wives Club.
