Norma was part of Bellingham High Schools first graduating class. She married George

W. Johnson on Dec. 3, 1938, and this year they would have been married 74 years. Together they were second-generation owners and operators of the Fountain Meat Market, where she was the clerk and bookkeeper until their retirement.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Norman and Bertha Grass, and sister Ella Hills (Jack) and Erma Brand (Gordon).

We had moved out to Bellingham in 1954 when Mobil Oil Refinery was built. We came from Olean, N.Y. Of course we had to find stores to get our food and one of the best meat markets was George and Normas and it was always our favorite market and we shopped there until they retired.

I want to say it was not only the best meat market in town , but a store we could go to and feel as we were with friends. There was not a dull moment when we entered the store that either George or Norma didn't bring up a subject that about family or a subject to tease us about and we always had a good visit. If one of them didn't start to pick on us the other did and we gave it right back to them.

The one time I remembered was I walked in and Lillian wasn't with me and George was alone behind the counter. I have always had back problems and George notice it the way I was bent over. He came around the counter and ask me if I would like him to help my back condition and I said yes. He got in back of me and had me in his arms and stretching my shoulders. About this a lady walked in the front door, looked at us and turned and walked back out. I don't remember what George said but he went back behind the counter and waited on me and I left.

We are sorry to hear Norma had Alzheimer's, and I know it is a terrible thing in the family to contend with. I say this as my wife Lillian has hallucination's and thinks that her three old maid aunts who passed away 50 or more years ago are living with us. I am 91 plus years old and so far have cared for her and her medications etc. My memory is deteriorating and I forget names(but not old memories and the good times)

George our dear Friend, if you are able to answer this letter or ,perhaps a loved one of yours, please let us know how you are doing. Please pardon the mistakes in my letter. I still mow the lawns and try and help Lillian in the house.
