She did let on how horrified she was by the artificial ingredients in the Cup of Noodle soups we sometimes brought for lunch. Her rule of thumb was if you can't pronounce it, don't eat it. lol

Over lunch we often talked about the English language, which was my favorite subject in school. As a teenager, I was surprised to find out how she didn't like the common expression "no problem." She pointed out it kind of implies that it could have been a problem. I still say it pretty automatically, though I always feel a little guilty afterward hoping the other person isn't taking it the wrong way.

She believed in God's promise to bless all the families of the earth and gave her life to do God's will in hopes of being able to help in that work after being resurrected if she was faithful until death. Her faith has become my own.
