Philip was a decorated U.S. Navy Veteran with 8 years of service. He worked as a Communications Officer at Simon Fraser University Department of Economics at the time of his passing. He received his Master's in Digital Marketing and Public Relations from Full Sail University in Florida, US, and was looking to pursue his PhD.
