Bud went to be with his Lord and Savior on November 5, 2015 at home with family by his side. He was born in Lynden, WA on March 5, 1921 to Emil and Esther Anderson. He is survived by daughters Lynne and Bev, six grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Bud graduated from Lynden High School in 1937 and married his high school sweetheart Bun on August 1, 1941, sharing almost 72 years of marriage.

Together he and Bun dairy farmed for over 30 years. In 1942 Bud started driving truck and hauling milk cans for Darigold, moving on to small milk tankers and finishing up his career with the big trucks and trailers with LTI. For over the 40 years he drove all over Whatcom County gathering friends and acquaintances where ever he went. Up to the day he passed he could recognize people, maybe not remember their names but never forgot their route number.

Bud and Bun were active members of Sunrise Baptist Church. For over seventy years this church was their spiritual family and the place where they dedicated their lives to raising their daughters in a Christian atmosphere.

After retiring Bud and Bun did extensive traveling in Europe, Israel and all over United States. Their big love was Southern Gospel Music. For over 30

years they traveled once a year to the National Quartet Convention in Tennessee and Kentucky.

The funeral service will be held Sunday, November 15th at 1:30 p.m. at Sunrise Baptist Church.
