



## Theodore J. Waterhouse

September 7, 2022, Theodore (Ted) J. Waterhouse left us for the big ski hill in the sky. He will be reunited with his two brothers (Harold & Robert), mother (Violet Carroll), father (Charles) and wife JoAnn (Hill) Waterhouse.

Ted was born on December 29, 1932 and spent his early years in Orondo and East Wenatchee where his mom was a teacher, dad was a principal, and the family worked in their fruit orchards. In 1951, he attended Wenatchee Jr College where he played football and was on the ski team at Mission Ridge. He was drafted into the Army in 1954. The highlight of the Army was being stationed in Germany and playing football. After being discharged in 1962 from the Army Reserves, he attended Western Washington University and earned his teaching certificate. He taught in the JobCorps, Luther Burbank Reform School, and for the Seattle Public Schools (Garfield High School and Rainier Beach) until retirement. He also coached tennis and taught drivers' education. Teaching helped fund his many ski adventures including running a ski school at Hyak, teaching lessons at Crystal Mountain, spending time at Silver Mountain, SunValley, Mt Baker, and any other ski hill he could find.

Ted spent many happy years in Port Orchard enjoying time with kids, grandkids, biking, and playing tennis. Ted leaves behind his three children, Tracie Morris, Terry Waterhouse, and Michelle King along with two stepdaughters Lynn Tueffers and Darlene Hanson. He also leaves behind seventeen grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren, with three more on the way.
