Virginia “Ginny” Tanguay was born in Bath Maine December 23, 1924 to Thomas and Martha Gallagher. Ginny married to Roland “Rocky” Tanguay on January 12, 1945 in Bath after a four month courtship. Her father said it would never last. In the sixty-eight years of married life they had a family of two sons and a daughter; Alan Michael (1945 – 1965), Patricia “Patti” Belik (Bob) of Everson, WA, Ron (Darcy and daughter Ashley) of Port Angeles, two grandsons, Ryan (Debbie) Belik, Seth (Michelle) Belik, and four great-grandchildren – Dylan, Makayla, McKenzie and Ryder.

Ginny worked as a bookkeeper most of her adult life; first at JJ Newberry’s in Yakima and Bellingham, Sound Beverage of Bellingham, and finally the family business – Bell Ice and Produce.
